- Please bring any silent auction items you would like to donate to the February meeting or to the mall during set up. Please, only "new" condition items gift cards work well also.



Indoor Orchid Growing



The following is a reflection of Berinie's talk on November 14th, 2021.

Bernie wrote an engaging, informative article about how he became 'addicted', entitled "The Orchid Challenge", for the CVIOS Newsletter in January 2021, that whetted my interest in learning about his setup for growing orchids. I was fortunate to be given a tour not long after and I really appreciated the chance to see how another member grows orchids indoors. With that in mind, I invited him to do a slide show for our members to share photos of his set up & divulging the nitty-gritty on how it all works. And it was worth the ask to get all the details.

So far Bernie has fitted out a set of garage storage shelves with coroplast and plastic sheeting, installed a lighting system and moisture. He went into the details of light units & strengths and the creation of the humidity providing fogger he built from scratch. He also covered fans & meters and other useful pieces of kit, with full details on where to source all of it. And he also gave details of the water filter he uses to provide the low ppm water he uses on his plants. To cap it all off, he showed lovely photographs of the flowers that have been flourishing in this indoor greenhouse.

He also showed his set up for growing beautiful phalaenopsis around his home and photos of many of the happy blooming plants.

Last but not least Bernie showed his new set up – an ExoTerra paludarium, that houses many of his miniatures & is complete with fish living in the pond at the bottom. Again, he shared details of the lighting, misting, fan & various meters in use.

Heads Up: Bernie has taken delivery of an Ikea cabinet that he will be fitting out for more orchids. I hope he will do a follow up on this new installation in the future. My enquiring mind wants to know more!

Thank you, Bernie. You have inspired me to transition most of my orchids to paludariums and aquariums. Now to become more tec savvy and get them all rigged out with the kit you recommend! The House of Hydro waterproof fan you recommended has now arrived ...

I always enjoyed our talks & got to know her much better. She was a kind determined person, yet willing to share her thoughts & keep me up to date on some of the people we both knew.
