

PREPARING ORCHIDS FOR OUR SHOW

- 1. Clean the pseudobulbs and leaves (water helps to soften the dry papery covering (cataphyll) around mature pseudobulbs so that you can gently rub it off).
- 2. Make sure any exposed roots are clean of algae or other deposits.
- 3. Make sure the media in the container is clean and free of weeds, algae & ants.
- 4. Wipe the top of the leaves: milk can be used or use a mixture of 1/3 isopropyl alcohol, 1/3 diluted peppermint Castile soap (follow instructions on bottle) or Murphy Oil soap and 1/3 water. Combine in a container. Spray on leaves and wipe with paper towel. This mixture is also good for pests.
- 5. Carefully inspect plant for pests and disease. Remove pests with alcohol or the mixture noted above for cleaning leaves. Use a toothbrush to get down to the base of the leaves and around the bottom of the pseudobulbs. If there is a bad infestation, leave the plant at home.
- 6. Inspect the flowers for Thrips and other damage if a flower is marred by the spots of Botrytis fungus it is best to leave the plant at home.
- 7. Carefully stake inflorescences if this will help present the flowers to their best (if you can plan ahead of time it is best to train the inflorescence as it emerges and is soft mature inflorescences are hardened off and can break easily).
- 8. Take a piece of masking tape, write the owners name on it and affix to the side or bottom of pot.
- 9. Remove any wire hangers, hoops, etc. and affix masking tape with the owner's name on it so it won't be lost or given to the wrong person.
- 10. Make sure the plant label is legible and secure in the pot.
- 11. Water each plant thoroughly before bringing to the show.
- 12. On a sheet of paper write your name, address and phone number and list each plant on a separate line. If known, list the parents. Please make sure the spelling is correct
- 13. Place each plant carefully in a large box or container for transport. To keep the plants from moving around and sustaining damage you can put crumpled newspaper around the pots. Some people use cotton, florists' shred or other material to protect the flowers and inflorescences from moving.
